

Curriculum Overview

Good morning parents and carers, members of the school community, teaching staff and most importantly, the boys of Coogee Prep, whose efforts and achievements we are here to acknowledge and celebrate today.

As we come to the close of another remarkable year filled with learning, growth, and discovery, it is with pride I stand before you today to provide an overview of our approach to the primary curriculum and touch on some of the exciting changes that will be implemented in 2024 and beyond.

In English, our Talk for Write program, which focuses on a three-stage approach where students imitate written texts, innovate and change them to make them their own, followed by planning and creating their own independent text, in conjunction with our Seven Steps for Writing approach, continues to combine explicit and structured instruction with fun, open ended writing activities that nurture students creative and inquisitive nature. We see the positive impact this approach to writing has on student achievement on a daily basis as it empowers them with a structured and effective method to produce well-crafted and articulate written work.

During daily reading groups students discussed, studied and analysed a range of quality literature from authors such as CS Lewis, Banjo Patterson, Jean George, Shaun Tan and Paul Jennings. In addition to supporting the development of reading as a pleasure and reading comprehension, these texts provide models of good writing for students to learn from and emulate, such as sentence patterns, text structure, vocabulary and word choice, use of conventions and language forms and features. Students daily reading progress at school and at home continues to be monitored, tracked and supported through our online Literacy Pro platform, and we have seen all primary students Lexile level increase by an average of 100 over the course of the year.

Our students continue to make excellent progress in Spelling and our three weekly Spelling Mastery lessons provide a comprehensive and systematic approach designed to enhance students spelling skills through explicit instruction, practice and application. By providing clear and consistent instruction, we continue to see overall improvements in students spelling abilities, an increase in their confidence in spelling and in their overall literacy development. Such is the success of Spelling Mastery, that we look forward to implementing a similar daily program focusing on Reading Comprehension skills for the duration of term 1 next year.

The Comprehension Express program incorporates diverse genres and topics to cater to different interests while developing students' abilities to understand, analyse, and interpret texts effectively. By providing targeted exercises and assessments, this program aims to enhance students' comprehension abilities, fostering their confidence and proficiency in comprehending a wide range of written materials. We look forward to seeing the positive impact this has on our student's confidence in reading and comprehension moving forward next year.

In Mathematics, students continue to make excellent progress and the learning programs we have implemented ensure that all boys develop essential numeracy skills and fluency, while nurturing the ability to think logically, critically and creatively. After seeing the impact that our Prime Mathematics program has had on the numeracy progress and achievement of our stage 3 students in addition to the positive feedback we receive on the readiness of our year 6 boys from their associated high schools, we are excited to extend the program to include our stage 2 students beginning next year. Based on effective teaching and learning practices in top performing schools in Singapore and Hong Kong, the program focuses on problem-solving, thinking critically, and mastering key math skills using a step-by-step approach. It starts with hands-on activities, moves to visual aids, and then progresses to more abstract concepts. By learning arithmetic, algebra, geometry, and data analysis in a structured way, our students develop a deep understanding of math while having fun.



The use of technology in the primary curriculum plays a pivotal role in enhancing learning experiences and preparing students for the digital age. This year we have continued to integrate technology across various key learning areas, emphasising its importance as a tool for learning and innovation. The use of MergeCubes, Makey Makey boards, Cospaces and other virtual and augmented reality technologies help to create dynamic and interactive learning environments that cater to diverse learning styles and abilities. This approach not only enriches the learning process but also equips students with the necessary skills to navigate an increasingly technology-driven world, fostering their creativity and adaptability in using digital tools for academic and real-world applications. In addition to delivering the current curriculum to our students, our primary staff have been extremely busy this year taking part in a range of courses and professional development opportunities relating to the familiarisation, planning and programming of the new English and Mathematics 3-6 curriculum to be implemented next year. Whilst the most significant changes are related to the teaching and learning of English, it is encouraging to know that many of the academic programs and digital resources we currently use in the primary classrooms support our students in meeting these new academic outcomes.

A school year as successful as this is not possible without the dedication of our teaching staff, the enthusiasm and hard work of our students and the ongoing support of parents and the school community. I would like to thank the primary teachers and support staff for their collegiality, commitment and professionalism in what has been an extremely busy year. We look forward to welcoming you back for another successful year of learning in 2024.

Primary Sport Overview

It is my pleasure to highlight and celebrate the outstanding sporting achievements of our young up and coming sporting talents across years 3 to 6 and to reflect upon the culmination of the 2023 sporting year.

Across all codes and seasons, the year was filled with determination, teamwork, and a relentless pursuit of improvement on the playing fields and courts. With Coogee Prep being one of the smallest schools in IPSHA, I couldn't be prouder of the positive attitude and approach taken by all boys each and every Saturday, often against schools that are 5 or 6 times our size. Once again CPS students have showcased exceptional sportsmanship, resilience, and skill development across both of the Summer and Winter seasons. With Saturday sport continuing to bring triumph and enjoyment to our school community whilst also instilling the values of discipline, camaraderie, honesty, perseverance and respect.

During our Summer Sport season - our Senior Touch Football Teams lead from the front, with both the A's and B's racking up multiple wins against quality opposition. Our Junior Basketball A's helped steer the ship on a Basketball front winning most of their games across both terms 1 and 4 and Our Senior A's finished the year on a high with multiple victories.

I would like to especially commend all of our Basketballers this year as all teams were delt exceptionally tough draws and divisions by IPSHA and yet week in, week out, they gave 100% and did themselves and Coogee Prep proud. Basketball remains a focus area moving into 2024 with ongoing discussions and plans regarding how we can foster competitive and enjoyable fixtures for all teams. With your assistance we will review Basketball at the end of Term 1 2024 and determine if it remains to be an enjoyable, successful and viable sporting option moving forward. With all of our sports we wish for all students to have even and competitive fixtures week to week, where they can develop their skills. I am pleased to report that -we will again have the expertise of ProBall and their coaches coming on board to assist with our afternoon training sessions in 2024.

Cricket had a resurgence in 2023 with the formidable Year 3 Cricket team having an onslaught of victories in Term 4 winning 5 out of their last 6 games, showcasing their strength, development and progression as a team from the beginning of the year. It will be great to see Coogee Prep field both an under 9's and under 10's cricket team in 2024.

During our winter sport Season - Rugby 7's and Soccer continued to be an integral part of the sporting year. Rugby 7's saw success across all age groups; especially within the U9's and 10's, where both teams won 80% of their games across the season. The Under 11's and Under 12's also saw success up at Koola Park winning a magnitude of games across terms 2 and 3.

Our junior Soccer teams once again showed determination and commitment after gaining tough divisions and draws. Special mention goes to both of our Senior teams who took charge of their divisions with our Senior Gold team winning the majority of their games and a massive congratulations to the senior Blue team who had an undefeated winter season.





Co-Curricular 2023

All activities are taught by qualified Coaches/Professionals and supervised by CPS staff.

The Co-curricular program focuses on extracurricular activities for students in Years Four to Six. In supporting the school's motto and academic curriculum, the co-curricular activities provide a platform on which students grow into healthy, capable, and confident young men.

The range of programs provides students with a pathway to develop their talent and skills in a safe, informative, and friendly environment. The activities are directed towards character development and unique learning opportunities for valuable life lessons and universal values, teamwork, self-discipline, and hard work. The Co-Curricular program also helps the transition into high school and beyond allowing the boys to widen their view on school activities, with a focus on activities that will be played and conducted well into their adolescent and adult life.

Activities in 2023 included:

- Sailing: Tacker's course. Learning to have fun on the water, Tricks, Techniques and learning to race.
- Tennis: Students work through levelled group-based lessons focusing on stroke correction, serving and games strategies. There are multiple competitions each week for boys to enjoy.
- Coding: Code Camp program. In small groups students work designing, making, and presenting projects across the code camp coding platform. Students created their own video game and then were able to play their own games.
- Golf: The concepts of driving, approaching, chipping and stroke play were all introduced. The boys competed in various mini games to see who could be king of the course.
