From the Principal: Mr John Dicks

Welcome distinguished guests, parents, staff, students, Old Boys and friends of Coogee Boys' Preparatory school, to our annual speech day.

It is an honour to stand before you this evening as we mark not only the conclusion of another successful year but also a truly remarkable milestone in the history of our school—110 years of excellence, growth, and impact. In 1914, as the world braced itself for great challenges of World War 1, a seed of hope and promise was planted here at Coogee Prep. Mr William Nimo established Coogee Boys' Preparatory School, on this site in the heart of Randwick. There were two other small Prep Schools in the Eastern Suburbs, Randwick Prep and Edgecliff Prep, that have since closed their doors, but Coogee Prep, has stood the test of time.

Over the past 110 years, that seed has grown into a thriving community, nurturing generations of learners, leaders, and changemakers. Today, we celebrate the legacy of those who came before us—the educators who inspired, the students who persevered, and the families who believed in the power of education. **Mr William Nimmo** our visionary first headmaster and **Mr Alan Nicholas Brown** our second Headmaster who fostered in his students to become Gentlemen Scholars and Sportsmen passed away in 2021. We celebrated his life by holding a memorial service and park bench dedication in August this year.

I thank the **Honourable Matt Thistlethwaite, Federal Member for Labour** who is with us today for attending and speaking at that dedication. As we reflect on this extraordinary journey, one thing becomes abundantly clear: Coogee Prep has always been more than just a school. It has been a beacon of opportunity, a hub of innovation, and a cornerstone of our community. From classrooms to sports fields, from music halls to chess competitions, our School has ignited curiosity, cultivated talent, and shaped the future.

This year, we have seen that legacy continue in countless ways. I thank my staff under the coordination and leadership of Mr Jason Wren Pattison who satisfactorily achieved another five years school registration. Our **NAPLAN** results for Years Three and Five were once again outstanding across Numeracy, Writing, Reading and Conventions of Language well done teachers and boys. Coogee Prep has ranked in the top 15 NSW Primary Schools. Our Primary Boys showcased their creative musical talents at the IPSHA Performing Arts Festival at the Sydney Town Hall and our Infants boys excelled at the Infants' Concert at the Randwick Town Hall. Each performance lead by Miss Oakes showcased the boys collective and individual talents and skills across many aspects of performance.

Our 110th dinner held at the Coogee Bay Hotel was well attended by parents past and present, and several Old Boys and their families came to support the school they still love. **Mr Trevor Danos Old Boy class of 1969** and parent of an old boy gave the evening speech, I quote the following from his address – *'Tradition matters at Coogee Prep and is valued. By tradition I mean wearing the uniform with pride, showing leadership, working hard, acting responsibly, being kind and obedient and acting with courtesy. In all these matters, the headmaster and teachers lead by example. The boys are taught to be rounded individuals who aspire to be gentleman, scholar and sportsman'.*

I thank **Mrs Tessa Morris** for her hard work and dedication to get our 110 CPS Cookbook out before the end of the year, a great initiative and top effort!

Our special guest **Mr Rodney Bassetti** (Bassetti Cup for U6 Athletics) and CPS Old Boy Class of 1954 joins us today to present the Major awards alongside Ms Gershon. Rodney has always been a huge supporter of Coogee Prep.

Today, we also look beyond the walls of our school. Over the decades, Coogee Prep has had an undeniable impact on the wider community. Our Old Boys have become doctors, teachers, entrepreneurs, artists, and leaders, each carrying the values of this institution into the world.



I'd like to remember **Mr William Dunlop Davison** who attended Coogee Prep under Mr Nimmo from 1921 to 1928, where he excelled in athletics and rugby at both Coogee Prep and Sydney Grammar. His son and our Patron, **Mr Geoffrey Davison** donated the 'William Dunlop Davison cup' for the 100-metre sprint championship presented annually at speech day. Mr Davison and his wife Emeritus Professor Rhonda Griffiths send their apologies for missing speech day but send their best wishes and congratulations to the staff and boys on their achievements this year.

Our students and staff have contributed to community projects, spearheaded initiatives for social change, and fostered a spirit of service that enriches everyone it touches.

I say to the Infants and Primary boys today, that you should be very proud for what you have achieved, for the progress you have made, for the friendships you have fostered and the leadership you have shown throughout the year. Today we acknowledge and recognise your successes at this prize giving speech day.

As we look to the future, let us remember that the next chapter of our story is being written every day. Together, we have the power to ensure that Coogee Boys' Preparatory School remains a place where dreams are born, where challenges are met with courage, and where every individual can shine and succeed.

Thank you to the staff for your unwavering commitment, to our students for your enthusiasm, drive and loyalty and steadfast support. This is a celebration of all of you and the incredible legacy you help sustain.



Curriculum Overview

Good morning parents and carers, members of the school community, teaching staff and most importantly, the boys of Coogee Prep, whose efforts and achievements we are here to acknowledge and celebrate today.

As we come to the close of another remarkable year filled with learning, growth, and discovery, it is with pride I stand before you today to provide an overview of our approach to the primary curriculum during what has been a very busy and extremely successful 2024.

Throughout this past year, the primary staff at Coogee Prep have been focused on and dedicated to rolling out the **new NSW syllabus for English and Mathematics**. This curriculum overhaul, designed to enhance students' foundational skills in literacy and numeracy, focuses on clear, structured and explicit learning sequences that support every child's progress.

Whilst we have always followed and believed in this approach to teaching and learning, the creation of the new mandatory syllabus has provided us with an opportunity to reflect upon, and introduce new and exciting programs that continue to engage students in their learning and support them in achieving academic outcomes.

Due to the success of our weekly **Spelling Mastery** lessons, this year saw the introduction of the Comprehension Express Reading Program within all primary classrooms. The program, which took place 3 times a week during terms 1 and 2, incorporated 10 research-based strategies to build students abilities in analysing and understanding texts. Daily lessons guided boys through both the immediate reading process and post-reading exploration, teaching them key strategies for decoding and interpreting content. Each lesson included reading texts that are designed to spark interest and were carefully chosen for their variety and relevance, ensuring they appeal to boys' interests while exposing them to a broad range of genres and themes.

By focusing on key comprehension strategies, offering engaging texts, and providing tools for ongoing assessment, this program, in addition to **Literacy Pro and Story Box Hub**, helps students not only improve and track their progress in reading comprehension, but also provides daily opportunities to encourage and develop a lifelong love for reading.

Another exciting educational tool introduced this year, that has impacted positively on our boys' proficiency in English is the *Writer's Toolbox* program. *The Writer's Toolbox* is designed to offer personalised support to each student, no matter their current writing level. Through its advanced artificial intelligence, the program provides real-time, tailored feedback, guiding students step-by-step as they improve their writing skills. Whether it's building sentence structure, improving grammar, or enhancing creativity, the tool helps students develop a strong foundation in writing.

What has made the *Writer's Toolbox* particularly effective is its ability to adapt to each student's unique needs. As students write, the Al analyses their work and offers suggestions for improvement, ensuring they don't just learn *what* to write, but also *how* to write effectively. It challenges them to think critically about their language choices, encouraging them to experiment with different writing styles and techniques. Over the year, this has led to greater confidence and proficiency in all boys' writing.



For our teaching staff, the *Writer's Toolbox* has provided valuable insights into student progress. Through a performance dashboard, teachers have been able to track improvements, identify areas where students may need additional support, and tailor instruction accordingly. This makes the tool not only a great resource for students, but also a powerful support for our teachers.

In **Mathematics**, students continue to make excellent progress and the learning programs we have implemented ensure that all boys develop essential numeracy skills and fluency, while nurturing the ability to think logically, critically and creatively. Due to the positive impact the **Prime Mathematics** program had on the numeracy progress and achievement of our stage 3 students in addition to the positive feedback we receive on the readiness of our year 6 boys from their associated high schools, we extended the program to include our stage 2 students from the beginning of the school year. Based on effective teaching and learning practices in top performing schools in Singapore and Hong Kong, the program focuses on problem-solving, thinking critically, and mastering key math skills using a step-by-step approach. It starts with hands-on activities, moves to visual aids, and then progresses to more abstract concepts. By learning arithmetic, algebra, geometry, and data analysis in a structured way, our students develop a deep understanding of math while having fun.

The use of **technology in the primary curriculum** plays a pivotal role in enhancing learning experiences and preparing students for the digital age. This year we have continued to integrate technology across various key learning areas, emphasising its importance as a tool for learning and innovation. The use **of MergeCubes**, **Makey Makey boards**, **Cospaces** and other virtual and augmented reality technologies help to create dynamic and interactive learning environments that cater to diverse learning styles and abilities. This approach not only enriches the learning process but also equips students with the necessary skills to navigate an increasingly technology-driven world, fostering their creativity and adaptability in using digital tools for academic and real-world applications.

Whilst we have seen firsthand the positive impact that technology has on boys' engagement and learning outcomes at school, we are also aware of the challenges parents and students face in relation to screen time in the broader community. Next year, we look forward to introducing one technology free day a week to allow boys to disconnect from technology and encourage a balanced approach towards the use of devices at school and at home.

A range of school **excursions and camps in 2024** offered boys a unique and enriching learning experience beyond the classroom. Visits to Symbio Wildlife Park, Kurnell National Park, China Town, Sculptures by the sea, Kids Giving back, our Primary School Camp to Katoomba and bi-annual Canberra Tour, enabled students to see real world applications of their studies in addition to developing important life skills such as adaptability, problem solving and teamwork as students navigate new environments and collaborate with their peers.

A school year as successful as this is not possible without the dedication of our teaching staff, the enthusiasm and hard work of our students and the ongoing support of parents and the school community. I would like to thank the primary teachers and support staff for their collegiality, commitment and professionalism in what has been an extremely busy year. We look forward to welcoming you back for another successful year of learning in 2025.




